Technical surveys

We've appointed the architectural, property and construction consultancy Pellings to support the programme. They will be arranging technical surveys to be carried out over the coming weeks so you may see their representatives on site carrying these out. The technical surveys involve site measurements and layout, locations of services such as electricity cables and gas pipework as well assessing soil conditions.
